Margaret Wheatley is president of The Berkana Institute, a global charitable foundation. She has been a consultant for a variety of organizations on five continents, ranging from Fortune 500 corporations and the U.S. Army to religious orders and the Girl Scouts. Dr. Wheatley is the author of *Leadership and the New Science* and, with Myron Kellner-Rogers, *A Simpler Way* as well as numerous articles on management and self-organization.

Rhoda Kadalie is director of the Impumelelo Innovations Award Programme, which rewards innovative government and civil society initiatives, and is based at the Institute for Democracy in South Africa (IDASA). Prior to this, President Mandela named her as a Human Rights Commissioner, and she founded the Gender Equity Unit at the University of the Western Cape.
