The Leadership Learning Community (LLC) is committed to building knowledge that will strengthen the practice of leadership development. LLC is a national organization of more than 150 leadership development program staff, program officers representing 50 foundations who invest in leadership development, and leadership scholars and researchers.

Members of the Leadership Learning Community believe that we can strengthen our individual and collective efforts to develop leadership that can transform society by connecting our learning, practice and resources. Collective learning is generated through learning circles organized around common leadership development interests, affinity, and region. LLC is dedicated to the public dissemination of all knowledge generated about leadership development through



the LLC national meeting, Creating Space, and LLC's website at www.leadershiplearning.org.

LLC was launched in 2000 and marked its fifth year with an external evaluation funded by the W.K. Kellogg Foundation. The evaluation team synthesized

interview and survey findings to describe LLC's unique approach to collective knowledge generation: "LLC creates a culture that brings diverse stakeholders together to build relationships and moral resources that contribute to substantive, practical learning and knowledge synthesis, sharing and dissemination on leadership development. The organization's product and processes intersect to create knowledge that is new and applicable to a variety of leadership development workers. LLC has accumulated a solid record of accomplishment and reach, and has, we believe,

become a singular and necessary organization in the field of leadership development."
